




Top Signs You're Vulnerable to Ransomware

#Password Illusion



We have implemented passwords across all our platforms. We believe that should be enough.

Weak, reused, or already leaked passwords that are easy to crack using simple tools.



Attackers used a single compromised VPN password without multi-factor authentication to disrupt critical fuel operations in the U.S.

Real Incident : Colonial Pipeline (2021)



#Backup Confidence



We back up our data regularly. Recovery will be easy if anything happens.

Backups are stored online and connected to the network. I will encrypt or delete those first.



Ransomware affected backups stored within the same system. This caused a major delay in recovery.

Real Incident : Norsk Hydro (2019)



#Antivirus Equals Safety



Our antivirus is active. We are protected from malware.

My fileless ransomware operates in memory and bypasses traditional antivirus software without raising alerts.



SamSam ransomware entered through Remote Desktop Protocol and executed scripts in memory, completely bypassing antivirus tools.

Real Incident : City of Atlanta (2018)



#One-Time Training Belief



Our employees completed cybersecurity training last year. They are aware of risks.

That training was outdated and not reinforced.
One phishing link is all I need.



A phishing email compromised systems and allowed REvil ransomware to spread through remote access.

Real Incident : Patch Tunnel Vision



#Patch Tunnel Vision



We keep our operating systems updated.
We are safe from vulnerabilities.

Your third-party software, routers, and VPNs
are not patched. That gives me an easy way in.



Attackers exploited an unpatched VPN vulnerability
that was widely overlooked, leading to ransomware
infections.

Real Incident : Pulse Secure VPN Exploit (2021)
